### **ALARIC THE GOTH: An Outsider's History of the Fall of Rome**

Through Alaric's story, Douglas Boin reveals the Goths' complex and fascinating legacy in shaping the history we thought we knew, but had never imagined from their perspective. Alaric grew up near the river border that separated Gothic territory from the Romans. He survived the emperor's decision to separate immigrant children from their parents, sending them hundreds of miles from their families or forcing them into slavery. Later, he was denied citizenship despite his service in the army, as Romans were deeply conflicted over who should enjoy its privileges: they wanted to buttress their global power, yet were insecure about Roman identity; they depended on foreign goods, but scoffed at foreign ways and mocked foreigners with a potent mix of bigotry and intolerance. The three nights of riots the Goths brought to the capital in ad 410— led by Alaric— struck fear into the hearts of the powerful, but were not without cause. Douglas Boin is a professor of history at Saint Louis University, and author of *Coming Out Christian in the Roman World* and two scholarly books on antiquity.

November 12, 1941: war and revolution were in the air. At the Shanghai Race Club, the city's elite prepared to face off their best horses and most nimble jockeys in the annual Champions Day races. Across town, thousands celebrate the birthday of China's founding father, Sun Yat-sen, in a new city center meant to challenge European imperialism. Thousands more Shanghai residents from all walks of life attended the funeral of China's wealthiest woman, the Chinese-French widow of a Baghdadi Jewish businessman. Through this colorful snapshot of the day's events, the rich and complex history that led to them, and a cast of characters as diverse as the city itself, James Carter provides a kaleidoscopic portrait of a time and a place that still speaks to relations between China and the West. James Carter, professor of history at Saint Joseph's University, is the author of two previous books on Chinese history, and is a Fellow of the National Committee on US-China Relations. **TOWER OF SKULLS: A History of the Asia-Pacific War, Volume I: July 1937-May 1942**

In 1937 the swath of the globe from India to Japan contained half the world's population, but only two nations with real sovereignty (Japan and Thailand) and two with compromised sovereignty (China and Mongolia). All other peoples in the region endured under some form of colonialism. Today the region contains nineteen major, fully sovereign nations. *Tower of Skulls* is the first work in any language to present a unified account of the course and titanic impact of this part of the global war. Covering with extraordinary detail campaigns in China, Singapore, the Philippines, and Burma, as well as the attack on Pearl Harbor, it expands beyond military elements to highlight the critical political, economic, and social reverberations of the struggle. Finally, it provides a graphic depiction of the often forgotten but truly horrific death toll in the Asia-Pacific region—over 20 million—which continues to shape international relations today. Richard B. Frank is an internationally acclaimed historian of the Asia-Pacific War. He was an aerorifle platoon leader with the 101st Airborne Division in Vietnam, and is the author of *Guadalcanal* and *Downfall*. He lives in Annandale, Virginia.

**FIRE IN PARADISE: An American Tragedy**

On November 8, 2018, the ferocious Camp Fire laid waste to almost the entire town of Paradise, California, a community of 27,000 people. At least 85 died, images of the fire transfixed viewers across the world, and the resulting devastation yielded a humanitarian crisis that continues to unfold. Written by a pair of Bay Area reporters who covered the story and its aftermath extensively, *Fire in Paradise* is a fast-paced narrative of the disaster based on hundreds of in-depth interviews with residents, fire-fighters and police, and scientific experts. Alastair Gee and Dani Anguiano capture an historic event, explore the reasons behind the increasing frequency and force of wildfires in our time, and describe the moving efforts to raise Paradise from the ruins. **THE INEVITABILITY OF TRAGEDY: Henry Kissinger and His World**

A fascinating intellectual biography of Henry Kissinger that examines his unique role in government through the lens of his ideas. It analyzes the continuing controversies surrounding Kissinger's policies in such places as Vietnam and Chile by offering an understanding of his definition of realism; his seemingly amoral belief that foreign affairs must be conducted through a balance of power; and his "un-American" view that promoting democracy is most likely to result in repeated defeats for the United States. Barry Gewen places Kissinger's ideas in a European context by tracing them through his experience as a refugee from Nazi Germany and exploring the links between his notions of power and those of his mentor, Hans Morgenthau, the father of realism, as well as those of two other German-Jewish émigrés who shared his concerns about the weaknesses of democracy: Leo Strauss and Hannah Arendt. Barry Gewen, an editor at the *New York Times Book Review* for thirty years, has written on politics, international affairs, and culture for several publications, including the *Times*, the *New Republic*, *Dissent*, and the *National Interest*. **THE PLANTER OF MODERN LIFE: Louis Bromfield and the Seeds of a Food Revolution**

In interwar France, Louis Bromfield was equally famous as a writer and as a gardener. He pruned dahlias with Edith Wharton, weeded Gertrude Stein's vegetable patch, and fed the starving artists who flocked to his farmhouse outside Paris. His best-selling novels earned him a Pulitzer—and the jealousy of friends like Ernest Hemingway. But his radical approach to the soil has aged better than his books, inspiring a wave of farmers, foodies, and chefs to rethink how they should grow and consume their food. In 1938, Bromfield moved to 1,000-acre Malabar Farm to explore his concerns about the environment and its ability to sustain us. Transplanting ideas from India and Europe, he created a mecca for forward-thinking agriculturalists and a rural retreat for celebrities like Humphrey Bogart and Lauren Bacall (who were married there in 1945). Stephen Heyman, a former *New York Times* editor, writes for publications such as *Slate*, *Esquire*, and *Vogue*. He is a Fellow at the Leon Levy Center for Biography and a National Endowment for the Humanities Public Scholar. He lives in Pittsburgh.

**THE BLACK BOOKS, 1913-1932 Notebooks of Transformation**

In 1913, Jung started a unique self-experiment that he called his “confrontation with the unconscious”: an engagement with his fantasies in a waking state, which he charted in a series of notebooks referred to as *The Black Books*. *The Red Book* drew upon material recorded therein from 1913 to 1916, but Jung continued to write in them for decades. *The Black Books* shed light on the genesis of *The Red Book*, the further elaboration of Jung’s personal cosmology, his attempts to embody insights from his self-investigation into his life and personal relationships. Presented in a magnificent, seven-volume boxed collection featuring a revelatory essay by noted Jung scholar Sonu Shamdasani and both translated and facsimile versions of each notebook, *The Black Books* offer a unique portal into Jung’s mind and the origins of analytical psychology. Publication will resound on Jung scholarship, Jungian professional circles, the broader public, and those brought to Jung’s work through acclaim of *The Red Book*. C. G. Jung (1875-1961) was a Swiss psychiatrist and the founder of analytical psychology. Sonu Shamdasani is Professor at University College London. He lives in London.

**MY KOREA: Traditional Flavors, Modern Recipes**

Hooni Kim is a chef who cooks with *jung sung*, heart and devotion. From simple rice cakes drenched in a spicy sauce to a 12-Hour Korean Ramyeon (ramen), Hooni uses his background in world-class French and Japanese kitchens to fine-tune techniques in classic Korean cuisine, which often originated in home kitchens. Readers will discover the Korean culinary trinity: gochujang, doenjang, and ganjang (Korean chili pepper paste, fermented soybean paste, and soy sauce). These key ingredients add a savory depth and flavor to the entire spectrum of Korean cuisine, from banchan to robust stews. Born in Seoul, Hooni Kim trained at Daniel and Masa before opening Danji, the first Michelin-starred Korean restaurant in the world, and Hanjan. He divides his time between New York City and Korea, where he is the founder of Yori Chunsa, a nonprofit that feeds and trains orphans to become cooks.

Over his four-decade career, Sid Meier has produced some of the world's most popular video games, including Sid Meier's Civilization, which has sold more than 51 million units worldwide and accumulated more than one billion hours of play. Sid Meier's Memoir! is the story of an obsessive young computer enthusiast who helped launch a multibillion-dollar industry. Writing with warmth and ironic humor, Meier describes the genesis of his influential studio, MicroProse, founded in 1982 after a trip to a Las Vegas arcade, and recounts the development of landmark games, from vintage classics like Pirates! and Railroad Tycoon, to Civilization and beyond. Acclaimed science journalist Annalee Newitz explores the rise and fall of four ancient abandoned cities, each the center of a sophisticated civilization: the Neolithic site of Çatalhöyük in Central Turkey, the Roman vacation town of Pompeii on Italy's southern coast, the medieval megacity of Angkor in Cambodia, and the indigenous metropolis Cahokia that stood beside the Mississippi River where East St. Louis is today. Instead, Saunt argues that it was a contested political act—resisted by both indigenous peoples and US citizens—that passed in Congress by a razor-thin margin. In telling the full story of this systematic, state-sponsored theft, Saunt reveals how expulsion became national policy, abetted by southern slave owners and financed by Wall Street. Despite modest origins as the child of Jewish immigrants in San Francisco, by the early 1940s talent and practice had brought Stern a Carnegie Hall debut, critical acclaim, and the attention of the legendary Sol Hurok. He would go on to make music on five continents, records in formats from 78 rpm to digital, friends as different as Frank Sinatra and Isaiah Berlin, and policy from Carnegie Hall to Washington, Jerusalem, and Shanghai. He also loaned instruments to young players, brokered gigs for Soviet emigrés, and replied in person to inquiring fifth graders. Wide-ranging yet intimate, *The Lives of Isaac Stern* is a portrait of an artist and musical statesman who began as a first-generation American dreamer and left behind a profound musical and cultural legacy. The richness, complexity, and sheer mass of J. S. Bach's music calls for a focused discussion of his work, based on a meaningful selection. This loss of faith has spread beyond government to infect a broad swath of institutions—the press, corporations, digital platforms—none of which seem capable of holding us together. How should we encourage participation in public life when neither elections nor protests feel like paths to change? Drawing on work by political scientists, legal theorists, and activists in the streets, Ethan Zuckerman offers a lens for understanding civic engagement that focuses on efficacy, the power of seeing the change you make in the world. *Mistrust* is a guidebook for those looking for new ways to make change as well as a fascinating explanation of how we’ve arrived at a moment where old ways of engagement are failing us. In the tradition of Said's *Orientalism* and Fanon's *Black Skin, White Masks*, *Afropessimism* is a provocative and unparalleled account of the non-analogous experience of being black.
