

Each spread focuses on a world-changing technology and how it led to or influenced the tech or discovery on the next page. ASTRONOMY

The printing press sparked revolutions in both religion and science. Ancient texts once locked away in distant libraries could now be reprinted and shared. This included books with mathematical data about the cosmos: Eighteen years after Gutenberg printed the Bible, the first astronomy book was printed. The printing press thus helped create a renaissance (rebirth) of astronomical discovery!

Look up in the night sky. Could you imagine making a map of all those stars? It would take a really long time. Just ask Tycho Brahe, a Danish astronomer who spent more than 20 years in his castle observatory recording a thousand stars. He used astronomical instruments like a giant wooden sphere to record the stars' locations. (Telescopes hadn't been invented yet!)

Tycho was a tough customer. His nose was cut off in a sword fight with his cousin over who was better at mathematics! He wore a nose made of metal the rest of his life. Later, in 1577, Tycho noticed a light streaking across the evening sky (a comet) while returning from a day of fishing. He would theorize correctly that this comet moved in a glant loop around the sun, something that even Galileo hadn't thought of yet.

At Stjerneborg castle, you can explore part of the original observatory where Tycho made his revolutionary findings that inspired famous astronomers such as Johannes Kepler and Sir Isaac Newton.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO Ven is a short boat ride from Copenhagen, and you can explore the whole island by blke! Be sure to play games in the castle gardens and visit the ruined paper mill where Tycho made his own books.

DANIEL K. INDUYE SOLAR TELESCOPE

Watch the sun explode from the top of the largest dormant volcano in the world.

Sitting atop a massive 10,062-foot-tall (3,067 m) volcano on the island of Maui is what looks like a giant white ice cream cone. Of course, this is no dessert. Instead, it's


the largest solar telescope in the world.

Just like how Tycho Brahe mapped the stars, the Daniel K.
Inouye Solar Telescope (DKIST) maps the sun. Inside the DKIST's
domed top is a 13-foot-long (3.96 m) primary mirror that peers
into the sun's depths. It captures images of enormous solar


explosions, known as coronal mass ejections, that shoot out clouds of hot plasma (energized gas) and bits of magnetic fields into space. Just one such explosion has the power of 20 million atomic bombs! When these solar ejections reach Earth, they sometimes create radio, magnetic, and thermal disruptions that can destroy satellites and power grids, effectively furning off our lights.

Astronomers hope to use the DKIST to understand how and why these eruptions happen. But learning the secrets of the sun may do more than just protect us from solar explosions—one day it may help us to power the planet.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO While you can't tour the telescope itself yet, you can drive up a steep and winding road to the top of Kula voicano and enjoy beautiful views of both the telescope and the island.

DID YOU HEAR WHAT HAPPENED IN SALEM?

The Witch Trials of 1692

By Katie Kennedy



One of the most chilling stories in American history gets the true-crime treatment in *Did You Hear What Happened in Salem?*, where trusted nonfiction author Katie Kennedy traces the legacy of misinformation and the misuse of power from the 1692 Witch Trials all the way to the modern day.

The Salem Witch Trials of 1692 started with some idle troublemaking among a group of bored preteen girls. They ended in the deaths of twenty people in a town torn apart by injustice and mistrust. The accusers' testimonies created the first stories of witches flying on broomsticks and using black cats as familiars, while their illogic and hypocrisy gave us the term "witch hunt." Over a million modern-day visitors descend upon Salem every year to visit the site of the Trials and imagine themselves into that haunted and fearful period . . . But they never see me.


Using the voice of a sorrowful and surprising first-person narrator — a historical figure that played a major role in the events — acclaimed historian Katie Kennedy tracks the motives and actions of the dozens of people involved in the Trials, from the power-hungry accusers to the anything-but-impartial judges to the all-too-human accused. She shows us how the accusations moved in waves and could have been stopped many times, but greed and fear drove events onward until the Trials ended as abruptly as they began. The fascinating context included here — political unrest, neighborly property disputes, and the possible effects of a "Little Ice Age" — helps readers gain a wider perspective on this quintessentially American horror story.

The events in Salem, Massachusetts, 1692, live on in our history, our politics, our dreams, and our nightmares as we march toward an unknown future in another new world. Could the terror of Salem happen again? Always, if we aren't careful.









Welcome to the magic of paperfolding—from flat piece of paper to 3D creature. No scissors or glue required!

Ingeniously designed using interlocking tabs and only two simple types of folds, Paperfold Sea Animals is a new kind of paper craft that's fun and mess-free for kids 7+. Punch out and construct an array of ten amazing models of animals from all corners of the ocean and its shores: a playful dolphin and calf, a regal walrus, a floating sea horse, a pelican gulping down a fishy meal, a sea turtle laying eggs in the sand, a pufferfish, a hammerhead shark, a prehistoric-looking anglerfish, an octopus, and a great blue whale. Then, on the back of each instructional sheet is a Fact File card—a set of surprising facts about the featured animal: Did you know that walrus tusks never stop growing? Or that octopuses have three hearts? Or that pufferfish are highly toxic, yet are eaten as a delicacy in Japan?

PAPERFOLD SEA CREATURES

How to Create Paperfold Sea Creatures

Learn these five general skills for folding and assembling the creatures. Then refer to individual instruction pages. Note these paper sea creature crafts are rated from basic to complex. Even the easier ones can require some time and patience, so start small, and ask for help if you need it.



SEPARATE


Tear out a template page from the book. Carefully release the perforated sea creature template from the page. (Dispose of any small paper scraps.)



O FOLD

There are two directions paper can be folded.

- Mountain folds, marked with solid blue lines: Paper gets folded down.
- Fold line is visible on edge of fold. (Most folds are mountain folds.)
- Valley folds, marked with dashed blue lines: · Paper gets folded up.
- Z-folds, also called pleat folds, are alternating mountain and valley folds.





- Flat folding: Use for straight, flattened folds. Fold templates along the blue fold lines.
- Press firmly along edges to make crisp, flat creases.
- Pinch-folding:
 Use for curves and folds that are not continuous.
- Pinch-fold templates along blue fold lines. Do not fold beyond blue line.
- · Pinch firmly along edges to make crisp creases.

- Don't be casual about making folds. Keep them crisp!
- Once paper is bent, it can't be unbent. Take your time, fold as indicated, and be precise. Your sea creature will thank you!



Dot patterns show areas that will be hidden or tucked away once the animal is folded.



AIOL (B)

There are two different ways to make joints

Interlocking slots connect by lining up slots, then sliding the two tabs together.



Mushroom tabs + slots connect by inserting a tab securely into its corresponding slot. The dotted tab is hidden inside when connected correctly.



Arrange the tabs so they are tucked inside the animal, rather than outside the animal. Dotted tabs will be hidden when this is done correctly.





SHAPE

Some animals require careful curling or bending.



6 COMPLETE

After assembly, compare with photograph. Gently make any necessary adjustments and make sure that your sea creatures sit or stand securely.

INSTRUCTIONS

1 Fold body template in half along solid spine line, pressing entire length into a crisp, flat crease. Unfold to continue.

2 At shoulder area, fold solid (mountain) lines out and dashed (valley) lines in, creating a hidden pleat and lifting necl upward. Pinch folds to flatten.












8 Carefully tuck each foot through slots in back. Fold along solid line at top of back panel and tuck flap into body. Adjust wings to match photo.




Creative Activities to Help Kids Cope with Loss and Keep Memories Alive

The 25 prompts, games, exercises, and keepsake crafts were designed by author Brie Overton, the clinical director at the Experience Camps for grieving children.


AKEEM KEEPS BEES!

This vibrantly illustrated book for kids aged 8 to 10 traces a year in the real-life apiary of Sankofa Farms as a father (the author) teaches his young son, Akeem, the basics of beekeeping. Told from Akeem's perspective, *Akeem Keeps Bees!* begins with the arrival and installation of a package of bees and follows the sequence of beekeeping tasks throughout the year, as Akeem and his dad inspect the hive, find the queen, deal with a swarm, harvest honey, and prepare for winter. Along the way, Akeem also learns the special role that the bees play on the farm. Every part of the process is illustrated for young readers, with graphically inspired panels and diagrams. The author, **Kamal Bell**, is a leading voice among Black farmers educating and inspiring Black youth about farming and beekeeping.


